Some days ago, our family and the Jewish world celebrated the Feast of Purim. This festival commemorates the events recorded in the Book of Esther. At that time, the Jewish people were under the rule of the Persian Empire, during the reign of King Ahasuerus, Xerxes I of Persia, 486–465 B.C. The events of Purim revolve around Haman the Agagite's plot to destroy all the Jews in a single day, the 13th of Adar. However, miraculously, God in His providence intervened to protect His people, Israel. He

used a young Jewish girl, Esther, to overturn Haman's scheme, leading to the preservation of all the Jews, through whom our Lord Jesus the Messiah, was born to become the Savior of the world. **For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord.** Luke 2:11.

Mordecai urged Esther to appeal to King Ahasuerus to stop Haman's plot. He said to her, **For if thou altogether holdest thy peace at this time, then shall there enlargement and deliverance arise to the Jews from another place, but thou and thy father's house shall be destroyed, and who knoweth whether thou art come to the kingdom for such a time as this.** Esther 4:14.

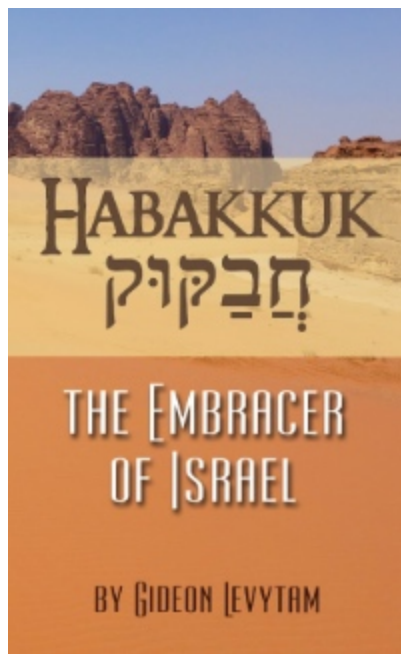


In obedience to Mordecai, Esther approached king Ahasuerus and pleaded for her people. In His sovereignty, God delivered Israel from Haman's wicked scheme. We read, And that these days should be remembered and kept throughout every generation, every family, every province, and every city; and that these days of Purim should not fail from among the Jews, nor the memorial of them perish from their seed. Esther 9:28. We praise God for His eternal plan and have recorded a message on the Feast of Esther.

Recently, we completed the study of the Book of Malachi, and have posted it on the YouTube channel of the Holy Scriptures and Israel. The study of the book of Malachi has been very encouraging to our Bible study group. Malachi, whose Hebrew name means My Messenger, was the last prophet of Israel, who, by the word of the LORD, promised to send the Messiah, the messenger of God's covenant with Israel. **Behold, I will send my messenger, and he shall prepare the way before me: and the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to his temple, even the messenger of the covenant, whom ye delight in: behold, he shall come, saith the LORD of hosts.** Malachi 3:1. Thankfully, that Messenger, the LORD Jesus the Messiah, did come. He first came to provide salvation through His death, burial, and resurrection for all who trust in Him. Malachi also prophesied that this very same Messenger, our Lord Yeshua the Messiah, will come again. On that future day, He will bring healing and salvation to His people Israel and to all who will receive Him. **But unto you that fear my name shall the Sun of righteousness arise with healing in his wings.** Malachi 4:2a.

We have now started to post the studies on the [Book of Habakkuk](#), the "embracer" of Israel. Habakkuk carried a heavy burden and struggled to understand why God allowed violence, strife, and contention among His people. In His grace, the LORD revealed His plan to Habakkuk. Through Habakkuk, we learn the importance of having concern for God's people, just as the Apostle Paul cared for the believers in the churches of Asia Minor. **For out of much affliction and anguish of heart I wrote unto you with many tears; not that ye should be grieved, but that ye might know the love which I have more abundantly unto you.** 2 Corinthians 2:4. May the Lord help us to develop love and care in our hearts for the believers in our Lord Jesus the Messiah.

Our in-person meetings have been a blessing, allowing us to enjoy fellowship and study the Scriptures together. We are always encouraged when we have new individuals that attend. Isaiah 55:11 reminds us that God's Word will not return void but will accomplish His purpose.
